

## The Brexit Burden: A Constituency level analysis

### Workplace-based Brexit shocks for 632 parliamentary constituencies of Great Britain

On 20 November 2018, the UK Trade Policy Observatory published [Briefing Paper 26 - The Brexit burden: a constituency level analysis for Hampshire and Sussex](#), that looked at the impact of Brexit on the 34 parliamentary constituencies in Hampshire and Sussex. It distinguished between workplace-based and residence-based shocks, where the latter accounted for geographic spill-overs between different places and commuting patterns (i.e. people do not always live and work in the same location). Specifically, we made the in- and out-commuting adjustment to convert Brexit shocks from a workplace-basis to a residence-basis.

While a full scale analysis – one that includes the in- and out-commuting adjustments – has not been done for constituencies outside of Hampshire and Sussex (although the plan is to conduct this analysis), today we are publishing our first stage results (i.e. workplace) for all of Britain’s 632 constituencies<sup>1</sup>: the potential loss of employment by constituency in the case of a ‘no deal’. The results – expressed as total employment lost – are summarised in Table 1 below:

The workplace-based Brexit shocks for 632 constituencies reported in Table 1 below are based on the ONS BRES employment data as sourced from the [nomis](https://www.nomis.gov.uk) website on 6 November 2018 – while the Brexit shocks for the 34 constituencies in Hampshire and Sussex reported in Table 4 in the Briefing Paper 26 are based on the ONS BRES data sourced on 19 July 2018. As a result of revisions to the BRES data, the employment losses for the 34 constituencies in Hampshire and Sussex reported in Table 1 above (results section), differ from those reported in Table 4 in the Briefing Paper 26. For example, based on our calculations using the July BRES data we found that the workplace-based Brexit shock for Brighton Pavilion may amount to a loss of 2,021 jobs – but using the November BRES data we find that this shock may amount to a loss of 2,001 jobs. For most of the 34 constituencies in Hampshire and Sussex the discrepancy does not exceed some 10 jobs – but with a discrepancy of 46 jobs, it is most pronounced for Worthing West constituency. This shows that in consideration of issues such as possible revisions to data, the precise number of potential job losses reported in the main briefing paper and in this document should not be taken literally.
